

Harlequin Floors Key to Successful Program at USC

Summary

The Glorya Kaufman International Dance Center is the 54,000 square foot home of the USC Glorya Kaufman School of Dance, one of the largest facilities dedicated to dance on a private university campus. Designed for an innovative curriculum that supports a range of dance styles, USC designated Harlequin to provide wall-to-wall flooring for a large 3,550 square foot performance studio as well as five additional dance studios in their new state-of-the-art building that opened in the fall of 2016.

Challenge

When the program's first BFA class arrived on campus in the fall of 2015, the new building was still under construction. Under constraints to provide a healthy learning environment for the new students, USC required a turnkey solution for Kaufman's transitional home. The building's classrooms with hard subfloors would need to transform quickly into dance studios with professional and safe sprung dance floors. The university sought a portable flooring system that could be utilized to convert the classrooms in the temporary space, yet also be used to support performances around the campus and arts community.







Solution

For the temporary classrooms, Harlequin's Liberty LatchLoc™ sprung dance floor panel system was the ideal solution. The floating floor does not need to be affixed to the subfloor and would do no damage to the existing classroom space. Modular panels are secured into place using a 'one turn of the key' latch and lock mechanism, making it quick and easy to install, remove or reconfigure.

When construction of the school's permanent home was finally completed, Harlequin WoodSpring®, was selected for installation in all of the studios. A modern interpretation of traditional 'basket weave', WoodSpring is a professional sprung floor system designed specifically for dance. It is specially constructed to ensure proper energy return,

shock absorption and resilience in order to help protect students from injuries. The sprung floors were finished with a Harlequin Cascade™ performance surface in the smaller studios and a maple hardwood surface was chosen for the large performance studio.
